It is our greatest desire that all persons who want to come to the NY Intensive be able to do so. However, limited funds are available for scholarships and we may not be able to meet the full need of all who apply for scholarships – so we welcome and encourage creative problem solving. Some of the factors that go into our decisions with respect to financial aid are:

- Economic need
- Potential to share NVC
- Previous NVC training

About work-study: We don't have a budget for work-study as such. We award financial aid based on need, and request assistance from those who are willing to assist our work in ways that they would enjoy. Such contributions of time and effort, which are made both by people who receive financial aid and those who don't, play a major role in keeping our costs down and increasing the amount of money available for financial aid.

Depending upon the contributions of other participants, we expect to offer limited assistance (\$200 - \$500) toward the tuition costs for some applicants. The cost of the New York Intensive includes tuition, (which covers the costs of the trainers, their expenses, support team, organizing expenses), and the costs for the retreat center (\$550 for a double, \$350 for commuters.) We are rarely able to pay the retreat center costs for any participants.
